FALLEN FROM GRACE

I was astounded to see her! Barely 18, of small built and petite, holding a two year old. Her child, I was told. Trafficked at the tender age of 15, she was abused, assaulted and abandoned on becoming pregnant.

This young girl had forgotten to smile, I was told. And not even when her toddler looked up to her and smiled, I noticed. Her trust had been broken by none other than her own family who sold her for a pittance. Brought across the borders of Bangladesh, she is one among thousands of girls who are trafficked and brought to West Bengal, an Eastern state of India.

In my recent visit to Kolkota, often referred to as the City of Joy, the girls / women are weeping tears of blood. I discovered that there are as many as 23 areas actively engaged in commercial sex trade. Most of them have been trafficked as minors from across the border of Bangladesh and Nepal and kept in cages where they service as many as 12-15 men per night. Most have been tricked by men they thought were in love with them or have been given promises of jobs.

Eager to get out of the clutches of poverty, most of them have fallen prey to tempting offers of a better life in areas beyond or have been sold by their own parents, brothers, family members or friends. Their trust totally broken, as well as their bodies from multiple abortions, many have children who grow up in the same locality and are sexually

abused at tender ages, even as most of them grow up right under the bed of their mothers who service customers. Many are HIV infected. Most of the brothel managers are women and the pimps are men, most sons of sex workers who have grown up in the same environment.

Violence is often accompanied by sexual assault and marks of severe injuries are covered by heavy make-up and yet have no respite from work. Unless, of course, a customer has vented his fury on the weak and vulnerable woman causing her grievous injury resulting in

profuse internal bleeding because of which she is rushed to the doctor. Yet, this is one part of India where goddesses are worshipped and revered. Very much like the rest of India where goddesses are created, decorated, adorned and made to sit on a pedestal. A point to be noted is that the soil used to create a goddess is taken from the garden of sex workers!

As long as the women like the goddesses are beautifully adorned and not open their mouths, they are revered.

Disha foundation (www.dishafoundationindia.in) has taken the real stories of these girls and women and put them in the form of a radio program that is broadcasted every Sunday from FM Kolkota. The cries of these girls had led to the birth of this program, for they said, "PLEASE tell the other girls and women to not fall into any trap." The listeners are calling from Bangladeshi border and from all parts of West Bengal to appreciate the program as well as share, in confidence, their life stories.
